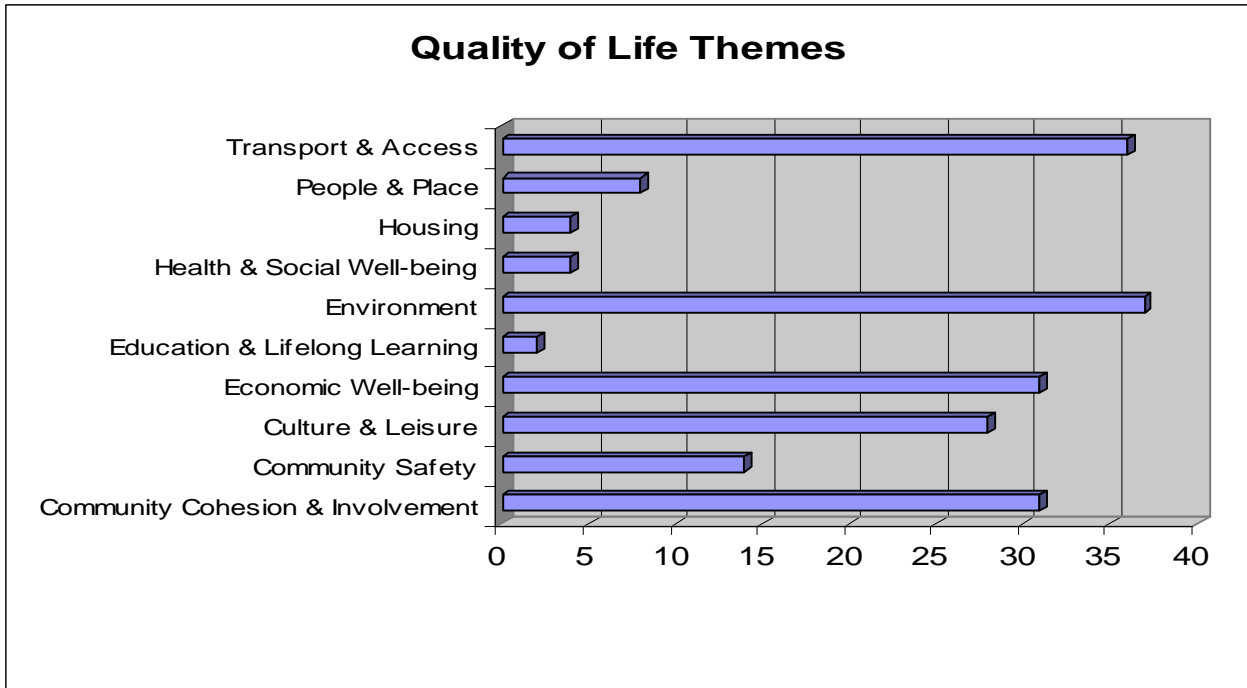


There are 8 parishes in Allerdale that are covered by community plans adopted since 2005. The chart below shows how the 195 actions described in these plans map against a standard range of Quality of Life themes.



The following bullet points illustrate the main types of action included under each theme, in order of frequency mentioned:

- **Environment – 37 actions**
 - built environment (14)
 - local “tidy-up” (12)
 - natural environment and biodiversity projects (5)
 - recycling (4)
 - access (2)
- **Transport & Access – 36 actions**
 - public and community transport improvements (8)
 - road, footpath and bridleway maintenance (7)
 - parking provision (5)
 - speeding and traffic calming (4)
 - access improvements (3)
 - road safety (3)
 - cycleways (2)
 - reduction in HGV traffic in village (1).
 - re-opening of station (1)
 - signing (1)
 - traffic noise (1)
- **Community Cohesion & Involvement – 31 actions**
 - local communication (12)

- improvement of community facilities (11)
- supporting and promoting facilities (6)
- community involvement & volunteering (2)
- **Economic Well-being – 31 actions**
 - business development and support (15)
 - tourism initiatives (6)
 - support for existing local services (4)
 - improve services (3)
 - broadband and phone services (1)
 - mobile service provision (1)
 - provision of utilities (1)
- **Culture & Leisure – 28 actions**
 - provision of more activities and social opportunities (18)
 - play, sports and recreation provision (8)
 - cultural provision (1)
 - improved library services (1)
- **Community Safety – 14 actions**
 - increased police activity/presence (5)
 - neighbourhood watch support (4)
 - local community safety actions (3)
 - improve local perception of safety (2)
- **People & Place – 8 actions**
 - improved dialogue between parish councils and local residents, including young people (5)
 - improving dialogue between communities and the local authority (2)
 - increase democratic participation (1)
- **Housing – 4 actions**
 - Increase provision of local affordable housing (4)
- **Health & Social Well-being – 4 actions**
 - service improvement (e.g. First Responders) (3)
 - investigate barriers to accessing services (1)
- **Education & Lifelong Learning – 2 actions**
 - adult education/course provision (2)
