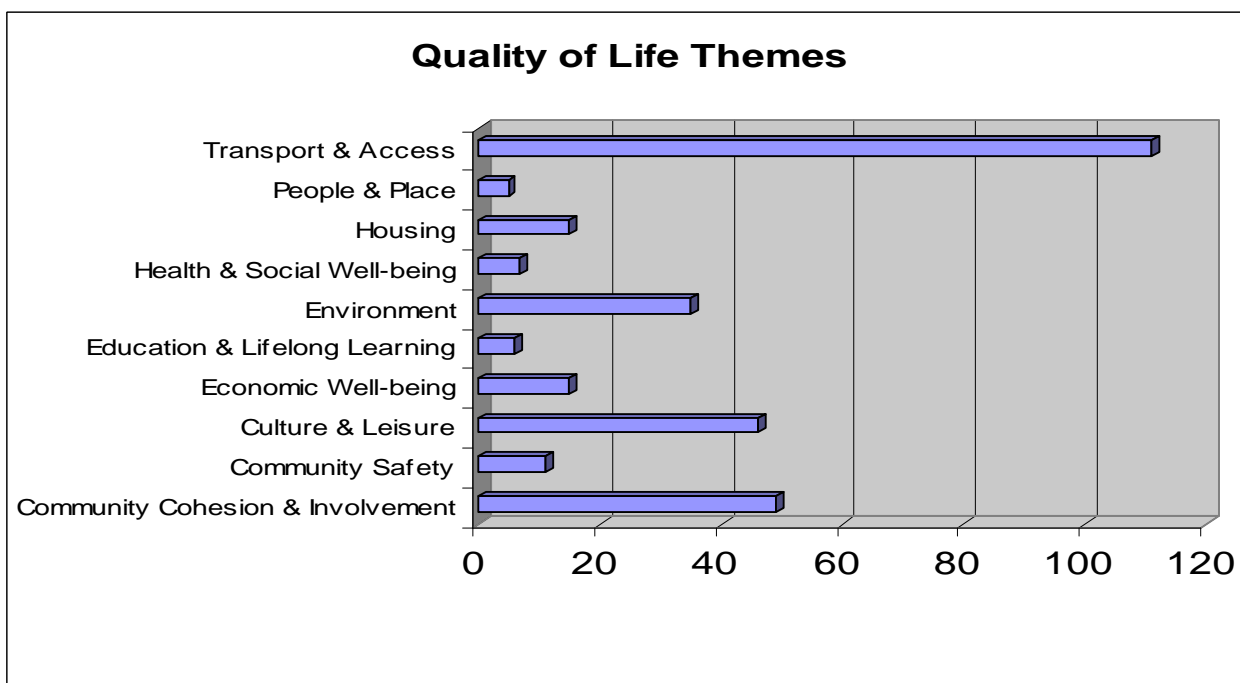


There are 15 parishes in Carlisle that are covered by community plans adopted since 2005.

The chart below shows how the 300 actions described in these plans map against a standard range of Quality of Life themes.



The following bullet points illustrate the main types of action included under each theme, in order of frequency mentioned:

- **Transport & Access – 111 actions**
 - road safety (21)
 - road, footpath and bridleway maintenance (19)
 - public and community transport improvements (18)
 - speeding and traffic calming (16)
 - parking provision (12)
 - access improvements (11)
 - improvements to rail services (6)
 - de-trunking of the A69 (4)
 - reduction in HGV traffic in villages (3)
 - lighting improvements (1).
- **Community Cohesion & Involvement – 49 actions**
 - local communication (18)
 - improvement of community facilities (16)
 - supporting and promoting facilities (10)
 - community involvement (5)
- **Culture & Leisure – 46 actions**
 - provision of more activities and social opportunities (30)
 - play, sports and recreation provision (13)

- improved library services (2)
- allotment provision (1)
- support of the Brampton Live Festival (1)
- **Environment – 35 actions**
 - natural environment and biodiversity projects (13)
 - local “tidy-up” (9)
 - built environment (5)
 - recycling (5)
 - climate change (3)
- **Economic Well-being – 15 actions**
 - support for existing local services (5)
 - tourism initiatives (4)
 - business support (3)
 - service inadequacies (2)
 - mobile service provision (1)
- **Housing – 15 actions**
 - housing needs surveys (11)
 - partnership working to deliver affordable housing (2)
 - housing site identification (1)
 - local design statements (1)
- **Community Safety – 11 actions**
 - increased police presence (7)
 - neighbourhood watch support (4)
- **Health & Social Well-being – 7 actions**
 - improved information about health services (3)
 - service improvement (2)
 - research into local needs and local delivery of services (2)
- **Education & Lifelong Learning – 6 actions**
 - adult education provision (4)
 - improved information about services (1)
 - local support to increase pupil numbers (1)
- **People & Place – 5 actions**
 - improved dialogue between parish councils and local residents (3)
 - improving dialogue between communities and the City Council (2)
